attention that the Devon County Council were considering the question of taking over Accommodation Roads and obtaining orders declaring that certain roads now repaired by the Council are unnecessary for public use, and ought not to be repaired at the public expense.

This letter was discussed at some length after the discussion it was decided that there were no roads unnecessary for public use, the Parish Council would like to call the attention of District Council to two roads which they think should be taken over by the County Council, one road from Billhole Quarry to the Compton boundary a distance of approx $\frac{3}{4}$ mile, the other road is from Public Hall to the Church a distance of approx 150 yds; the clerk was instructed to write District Council to this effect

Houses

The clerk reported that the District Council had granted four houses for the parish. It was agreed that the parish Council meet the housing committee in picking out the site for building these houses, as there were four sites available

Accounts The accounts were made up for the past year, a cheque was signed by the chairman for payment of same

Houses

The first business was about the houses, it had been proposed by Crediton District Council that two houses be erected on the Withenidge site now, where houses were now being erected for the South Molton Council.

This was discussed and members thought it was not in the best interests to build at Withenidge from a rating point of view, it was best to build at the original site on the Shobridge parish, it was decided to await a letter from the Clerk of district Council to tell this council

of this road by Woodford were agreeable
to the widening

The chairman signed a cheque for
£2-12-3, the amount for rent of room 10f
and the cost of council election £2-2-3
