Registration

The Clerk produced a Circular letter from the Local Government Board dated 1916 in respect to the Registration of Voters Act 1916 and explained to the Council

Overseers present salary and emoluments
He also pointed out to the Council how
the old system of payment for the Voters
List had been worked in the past and
how there had been a great temptation
open to Overseers to do the work as badly
as possible so as to get more for their
work than they would if they did it
properly

The Council were unanimously of opinion
that this system should not continue
any longer and on being appealed to as
to what he would be prepared to accept
yearly from March 31st 1916 in Lieu of the
usual allowances for the Voters Lists the
Assistant Overseer stated that he would
be prepared to accept the Salary of £6 a
year instead of £2 a year as heretofore to
include all allowances and expenses in
connection with the preparation of the Voters
Lists except printing of the same

This the Council thought ^{this} to be the most
satisfactory way by far to deal with the
matter and it was resolved that the
same be placed on the notices for the
next meeting to be confirmed

Accommodation A complaint was made about the

The Clerk reported having seen Mr Oliver Tucker (one of the Charity Trustees) as he was requested in reference to the difference in the amount of money received and distributed by the Trustees in 1915 as compared with the previous year of 1914.

Mr Tucker's explanation was that owing to Easter being early in 1915 one amount from the Official Trustees was not received in time for the annual distribution in that year but would be included in the distribution for this year. This explanation was considered very satisfactory.
