The Annual Meeting of the Parish Council was held at Millbarn on the above date Present Messrs F J P Maunder, H A Maunder & Cole W Blackford J Hayes & Partridge and the Clerk

Declarations All the members present signed the usual Declaration of acceptance of Office

Election It was proposed by Mr Blackford seconded by Mr Harrison and unanimously resolved that Mr F J P Maunder be elected Chairman until the 16th April 1920

On the proposition of Mr Blackford seconded by Mr H A Maunder Mr E Cole was unanimously elected Vice Chairman until April 16th 1920

Overseers On the proposition of Mr E Cole seconded by Mr F J P Maunder the retiring Overseers Messrs John Hayes of Woodhouse Farm and

unanimously reelected with 1672 votes.

~~Finance~~ <sup>17/9</sup> A Cheque for £10/- was signed for the payment of the Parish Council Election expenses and ~~ex-service~~ New Declaration book.

~~Men~~ The Clerk produced a letter received from the County Council in regard to the training of ex-service men by selected Farmers and after considerable discussion it was unanimously resolved to reply stating that although the subject had been brought to the notice of nearly every Farmer in the Parish no one cared to entertain the proposal as they considered the pay offered was not sufficient to meet the circumstances of the case and moreover the Council did not see why the Tax payers money should be wasted in paying for the training of men who could well afford to pay for themselves to the exclusion of the poorer class of ex army men.

~~Housing~~ This question again came before the Council ~~most~~ and the Clerk was instructed to write Mr. Lucy Whilton of Exeter the Agent for the Will Barton Estate asking if the owner would be prepared to sell sites for Cottages in a field called Little Farmer Close on the above Estate and also to supply which it was considered could be got <sup>stones</sup> in an adjoining field for Building the Cottages in case of failing to obtain this site the same Agent was so he asked if he would sell a garden at a place called Stretchdown on the same Farm where a cottage formerly stood and where there was just room for two cottages without gardens. In the event of this site being obtained the

gardens in a field he had close by  
A site for two Cottages was also offered by a  
Member of the Council (Mr Blackford) on his Farm  
and which was his own property at a place  
called Doctors corner about midway between  
Wetheridge and Thelbridge

The District Councillor (Mr Cole) reported that  
a Surveyor would be coming to view the sites  
shortly and it was resolved that as many as  
possible of the Council should meet him when  
he comes.

inspect the sites for Cottages to be erected

After inspecting various sites it was  
unanimously resolved to recommend  
as the most suitable a site in a field  
belonging to the Chairman abutting on  
the main road from Wetheridge to Linton  
at a point near Chaper Lane.

It was resolved to confirm the Assistant  
Overseers <sup>Re</sup> appointment at the same salary  
notwithstanding any payment he may  
be receiving from other sources in respect  
of the Voters Lists

A Parish Meeting was held at Millbarn on the above date to arrange for the holding of Peace celebrations for the Parish.

Present Messrs. J. F. Mander in the Chair  
Rev'd J. H. Hosegood, Mrs Leach Senr. and junior  
Miss Hammond, Miss Hooper, & Ayre & Cole  
H. Mander, E. Partridge, H. Blackford, H. Bristow  
J. Gelling & C. Tucker and H. Tolley

It was resolved to hold a Public tea with sports and a Dance on Saturday July 26th in  
the H. Bristow's Meadow if fine but if wet  
Mr. C. Tucker, and H. Blackford kindly  
offered to collect subscriptions and a  
Committee was formed to make all the  
necessary arrangements in connexion with  
the same, the Committee to consist of the  
Rector, Miss Hammond, Miss Ward, Miss  
Hooper together with all the Farmers  
and their wives and the Clerk of the Council (H. Tolley)  
the last named to call the Committee  
together for Monday evening July 21st at  
7-30 to receive the report of the Collectors  
and to make all other necessary arrangements  
for the celebrations on the 26th inst.  
It was also resolved to ask Mr C. Richard to  
attend the celebrations with his roundabout  
and swing boats.

Following on the above a further meeting  
was held on Monday July 21st at 7-30  
p.m. At the beginning of the meeting the Rev'd  
J. H. Hosegood who had been voted to the chair

the Parish had sustained since their last meeting in the death of their Chairman Mr F J Pmaunder who was taken ill whilst attending the previous meeting on the 17th inst A resolution of condolence with the Family was unanimously carried and the Clerk of Parish Council requested of convey the same to the members thereof

It was reported that nearly £8 had been collected towards the celebrations and it was resolved to have a meat Tea for all over School age the Witheridge Club Tent to be hired for the purpose and a short service to be held therein at 3-30 to be followed by tea, sports and dancing, committees being appointed to carry out the various items on the programme and to obtain the necessary provisions

A Public Meeting was held on Friday Aug 8th 1919 with the Revd J H Glascott in the Chair to receive the Treasurers report and Balance sheet in connexion with the Peace celebrations

It was found that the total receipts were Thirty pounds eight shillings and eleven pence  $\frac{1}{2}$  and the total payments nineteen eighteen shillings and eleven pence leaving a Balance of Ten pounds ten shillings and an  $\frac{1}{2}$  in hand and after several suggestions had been made it was unanimously resolved to spend the balance in providing a public tea

## Harvest Festival

The Chairman thanked all who had helped to make the celebrations such a success especially the Ladies who had managed the Tea and those who had collected the subscriptions.

June 8th 1919

A meeting of the Parish Council was held on the above date, present Mr E Cole in the Chair, Messrs H Blackford, H Fisher, G Partridge, J Hayes, J Ayre, and the Clerk. Minutes the Minutes having been read and signed by Mr Blackford proposed, Mr Fisher seconded and it was unanimously resolved that Mr Cole be elected as Chairman in the place of the late F J Mannader and on taking the Chair proposed a Vote of condolence with the family of the Late Chairman in the loss they had sustained by his death having been Chairman of the Council since the Council was first formed in Decr 1894.

It was proposed by Mr Partridge and seconded by Mr Fisher and unanimously resolved that Mr Blackford be elected Vice Chairman in place of Mr Cole.

It was proposed by Mr Blackford seconded by Mr Fisher and unanimously resolved that Mr Thomas Ayre of Billhole be

caused by the death of the Late Chairman Mr Ayre being present signed the usual Declaration to Acceptance of Office  
 treasurer. It was proposed by Mr Blackford seconded by Mr Fisher and unanimously resolved that Mr G F Mansfield of Lost Fowler & Sons Bank Withenrigg be elected Treasurer in place of the Late T L P Mansfield.
